### FoodBank SA: End Hunger

Foodbank SA is a community group that manages the flow of surplus and donated food from the food industry to community support agencies feeding people in need in SA. Food is edible but unsaleable due to incorrect labelling, damaged packaging or close to 'best before' dates.

**How does it work?** If your community group provides food—either as food parcels or prepared meals—to people in need, and holds appropriate insurance, you may be able to access food at a greatly reduced cost. The size of your group does not matter—consider partnering with groups in a nearby town or creating an ecumenical project.

**Remember that Anglicare Willochra Grants provides seed funding to set up new projects such as these.**
