RESPONDING TO THE CORONA VIRUS (COVID-19)

N.B. The Anglican Church of Australia has issued National Guidelines concerning the church's response to COVID-19 which are updated regularly; they can be found at <https://anglican.org.au/resources/covid-19/>

Since releasing the first update concerning the Diocesan response to COVID-19 on the 17th March, the situation has continued to be dynamic. This update reflects the Roadmap for Easing COVID-19 Restrictions issued by the S.A. Government that come into force on 19th June:

As of the 19th June 2020, the guidelines are as follows:

1. Two (2) Square metres is to be allowed for each person for any gathering
2. 1.5 metres between people still applies
3. **Weddings and Funerals are now limited to 100 people in attendance (N.B. the actual capacity below 100 is determined by capacity adhering to 1 and 2 above)**
4. Your authorized COVIDSafe Protocol is still to be followed
5. A live-streamed service is available on Sunday mornings on the diocesan Facebook page, the location from which the service is made available will vary as will the time, this will be announced on the dioceses' website and Facebook page (these are accessible later via Facebook and YouTube <https://www.youtube.com/channel/UC90Pjc4uikrgBm-OCtGa6-g>)
6. Morning Prayer is live-streamed at 8:00 am each day except Sunday on the diocesan Facebook page (these are accessible later via Facebook and YouTube)

7. Morning Tea may occur ensuring that the authorized COVIDSafe Protocol is followed and that no utensils are shared (see previous communication about this)
8. Op Shops, Cafes, and Mission to Seafarers may operate as long as they have a COVIDSafe Protocol which has been authorized
9. The S.A. Government have not banned singing in church (NSW and Victoria have)

As things continue to develop, I will issue further updates.
