Essence

Blessed

Through Jacob's divine encounter and a parable about a harvest of promise, we enter a place of blessing assured of a God who is ever-present, all-knowing, and all revealing.

## Transform

As we watch and wonder as the tables turn and Jacob becomes the victim of trickery and listen and imagine as Jesus offers metaphors to describe the realm of God, we are inspired to remain open to God's work of transformation in our midst.

## Strive

Through Jacob's wrestling and a challenge to feed a multitude with a few loaves and fish, we wrestle with the concept of blessings and consider the blessings we strive to claim.

## Dream

We meet Joseph as he is lifted from a pit into an unknown future, hold our breath as Peter is lifted from the chaos of the sea and are encouraged by the possibility and potential of living into the unknown.

## Reach

Joseph and his brothers' move toward reconciliation, a psalmist's proclamation of the goodness of family harmony, and the reach by Paul and a mother to include Jews and Gentiles moves us to take a more active role in opening doors within relationships.

## Act

A story of cunning midwives, a courageous mother, and a vigilant sister provides examples of what it means to act and to live our faith in response to God's call and ask, "Where in today's world is the church called to acts of subversion, defiance, and disruption?"
